

Sixth Judicial District Court Adult Drug Court Program Program Referral Checklist

- Defendant's instant offense is probation eligible. NRS176A.100(1)(a).
 - Defendant is not a habitual criminal pursuant to NRS 207.010.
 - Defendant is not a habitual fraudulent felon pursuant to NRS 207.014.
 - Defendant is not a habitual felon pursuant to NRS 207.012.

- Defendant's instant offense is not a category A felony, or a sexual offense as defined in NRS 179D.097 that is punishable as a category B felony. NRS 176A.240(4).

- Defendant has obtained and filed prior to sentencing a **substance abuse evaluation** that identifies Defendant as having a substance use disorder and **recommends the ASAM level (type and duration) of treatment**. NRS 176A.240(2), (3).

- ❖ Any instant offense that is a sexual offense as defined in NRS 179D.097 that is punishable as a category C, D, or E felony, Gross Misdemeanor, or Misdemeanor will be staffed on a case-by-case basis to determine eligibility.

- ❖ All Defendants required to register as a sex offender will be staffed on a case-by-case basis to determine eligibility.
 - Key factors to consider in determining eligibility for registered sex offenders: access to treatment services, housing availability and safety of participants.
